WMU OFFERING – THE HECK-JONES OFFERING

Your support of this offering enables WMU NC's missions and ministry endeavors. God continues to provide for WMU NC in remarkable ways. The theme for 2010 is “Faces and Places of WMUNC”, and the goal is \$1.3 million. The missions and ministries of WMU NC include Restorative Justice (prison) Ministry; Camp Angel Tree; NC Baptist Nursing Fellowship; Camp Mundo Vista; Ministers' Spouses Support; Military Ministry; Multicultural ministries; Missions Training and Missions Leader Training; NC Christian Women's Job Corps/Christian Men's Job corps; Missions Partnerships; Missions Organization Start Up and Support; Promotion of Missions Awareness, Missionary Start Up; and Short-term Missions Volunteers.

NORTH CAROLINA MISSIONS OFFERING

North Carolina Baptists support missions and ministry year-round through their Cooperative Program. But each September they contribute to the North Carolina Missions Offering, which directly funds five major ministries: Baptist Men and their 14 ministries, from disaster relief to medical/dental ministry; Church Planting ministry – by more than 100 church planters who are started an estimated 100 or so new churches across the state during 2008; A new missions program to help churches learn about missions and do more missions projects; Funding for associations to pursue dozens of different missions projects; New mission camps which will be a series of centers for ministry projects throughout the surrounding areas. The first camp has already been established in Roberson County.

The North Carolina Mission Offering goal for 2009 was \$2.1 million.

Financial Gifts

COOPERATIVE PROGRAM

Every time you drop a dollar in the offering plate of a church that participates in the Cooperative Program, you help someone hear the story of Jesus. Southern Baptist churches voluntarily send a percentage or a specified amount of their regular offerings to the state convention. The state convention keeps approximately two-thirds of those funds and the balance is sent to the Southern Baptist Executive Committee in Nashville. The Executive Committee distributes those funds to Southern Baptist agencies. The international Mission board (IMB) currently receives half of the funds sent to the Executive Committee. Cooperative Program funds represents about 33 percent of the IMB's annual budget.

LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS OFFERING

The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering makes up 50 percent of the International Mission Board's total income and the Cooperative Program 22 percent. Every penny given to Lottie Moon is used to support Southern Baptist missionaries as they share the Gospel overseas. This allows your church to join in a strategic global effort to reach the whole world. It also enables your missionaries to spend their time working to reach lost souls instead of raising their own support. The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in 2009 was \$175 million.

ANNIE ARMSTONG EASTER OFFERING

The Annie Armstrong Easter Offering helps our missionary force reach for Christ an estimated 251 million lost people in the United States and Canada; that's three of four people. The national goal for 2010 is \$70 million of which one hundred percent is used to support missionaries and their work. The North American Mission Board has 5,271 missionaries serving in the United States and Canada. These missionaries start new churches, engage in student evangelism on college campuses, serve the physical and spiritual needs of people through inner-city Baptist centers, serve in local Baptist associations as associational missionary or other mission staff, provide training and ministry in apologetics (interfaith witness) evangelism, and minister in resort setting such as campgrounds and ski areas.

COOPERATIVE BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP

Made up of individual and approximately 1,900 affiliated churches, the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship is an organization that serves a larger renewal movement among Baptists. Partnering with 15 theological schools, 19 autonomous state and regional organizations and more than 150 ministry organizations world wide, CBF has an annual budget of \$16 million.

CBF has four ministry focal areas, which are called strategic initiatives. They are Building Community and Networking and Faith Formation, which are implemented by the Congregational Life department that provides ministry-enhancing resources

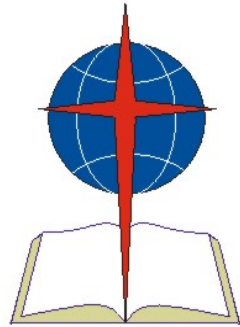

Wilkes Prison Ministry

Mission Statement

The Mission Statement of the Wilkes Prison ministry is to continuously research and verify new avenues to help inmates with their transition from incarceration back to freedom and give them hope as well as opportunity to succeed in society in order to praise and glorify God through their success.

Programs and Services of Wilkes Prison Ministry

Religious Services – Various religious services are conducted 7 nights per week. Sunday School and Sunday night services are provided as well as Wednesday night prayer meeting and Worship.

Discipleship – To provide ongoing discipleship, revivals, on site baptism, and communions are held in the prison chapel. Free bibles and religious materials are provided.

Music/Literature – Christian concerts are provided for the inmates. There is a chapel library and lending service of Christian literature and music. Greeting cards are available for inmate use.

Bible College Courses – Bible college courses are available.

Angel Tree – This is a program that allows children of inmates to receive gifts in honor of their fathers at Christmas. This event is provided by community volunteers.

Birthday Angel – A birthday card and gift are provided for children of inmates. This service is also provided by community volunteers.

Inmate Birthdays – At the end of each month, inmates are presented cake and ice cream to celebrate their birthdays. Volunteers are welcome to participate and assist with this.

Yokefellows – Yokefellow Prison Ministry yokes churches to Prison Ministry and to inmates who are currently incarcerated as well as after release. It is a small group Christian fellowship providing a ministry of listening and caring. Intentional spiritual growth is encouraged.

Special Programs

Re-Entry Program

Purpose: To assist inmates who are nearing release with issues and problems they will face upon re-entry into society. Job-hunting, goal setting, community resource and the importance of a spiritual base are taught. Classes meet for 18 weeks.

Father's Accountability Program

Purpose: To cultivate and support the attitudes and skills for male nurturing, hoping to benefit men, women, and children in family relationships. Classes meet for 12 weeks.

Transition House

The “Transition House” will assist in helping inmates locate employment and other social service agencies that will promote their transition back into society. At the same time, they will be provided housing, transportation, spiritual strength, food and security.
